With the participation of students from all over the world, the project seeks to create a culture of encounter, bringing young people closer to an education that generates meaning, discussing online and suggesting concrete solutions to the socio-cultural problems that exist in the world. The issues addressed by the students are aimed at transforming themselves and the environment in which they live.
